First the bad news...

A friend who heads up a Christian organisation that offers help to people in times of trouble wrote on 15th July:

Yesterday we heard about the destructive landslide in a place called Arughat. It happened on 13th July at 6 pm. People were able to save themselves. 40 families lost what they have and have houses damaged. 4 of them were totally under rubble. The location from Pokhara is around 200 km rough road and it is still raining.

Then on Tuesday 19th July he wrote:

Thank you for your prayers, words of encouragement and all other support. We headed to Arughat on Friday and stayed in the municipality town for the night. The next morning, we started the journey to the landslide place. It was very different to our imagination. We thought we would easily reach in 3 hours' journey but the track was just open and damaged by the rain. We reached the place of the landslide with great difficulty. However, it was a joy to meet with the people affected by the landslide. They valued our presence along with the supplies we had for them. We were the first group to reach there with supplies and meet them. listen to them and see their conditions. They wanted to show us the conditions of their houses, many were hit by the landslide with mud around and in the houses that remained. They are displaced and living with their neighbours and relatives. Monsoon continues.

Whilst we are greatly saddened by the news we are hearing of floods and landslides, it is good to know that churches are working together to make this help possible. We pray more will get involved and also that government aid will be made available to those that need it.

Now the good news...

As we write, hot off the press, we have just heard the news that the KISC visa process has been moving forward. Our friend writes...

I am pleased to inform you that our existing agreement with the Ministry of Education is now finally renewed for the next 5 years. It was a huge relief, since our summer break has been spent chasing up the agreement and visas. Praise the Lord for His faithfulness over KISC... the process is almost completed at the Labour Department. This means we will start working with Immigration Department next week to start stamping your visas.

So, our return should be quite straight forward with a quick transition from tourist visas on arrival to the oneyear work permit we need. That will make things a lot smoother for us.

Meanwhile we are thanking God for fun times with our family and the provision of a base in Felixstowe and we ask you to join with us in praying that we will fully recover from the effects of Covid and be able to enjoy the coming weeks of travelling around and meeting up with many of you.
